

An Easter Recipe...Empty Tomb Pastries

Luke 24: 1-12

Read the scripture first then take your child through the making of the tomb

- I. Take a crescent roll and spread it out flat
(The roll will puff up when it cooks and represents the tomb where they lay Jesus after his death on the cross)
- II. Take one marshmallow, this represents Jesus, place it in the center of the roll.
- III. Paint butter on the roll and sprinkle with cinnamon sugar.
(This represents the oils and spices they covered Jesus with as they prepared His body for burial in the tomb)
- IV. Cover the marshmallow up with the roll; make sure to close all holes by pinching the dough together. (This represents closing up the tomb.)
- V. Place it on a pan or use a muffin cup and cook according to directions on the crescent tube.
(This waiting time is like waiting for Easter. After they are cooked and cooled Jesus (the marshmallow) is gone. Just like on Easter they found the tomb empty. Eat the sweet treat; and remember how sweet it is to be loved by God! God sent his son Jesus to show us this love!)
